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Engineering Council Partners with Distance Education Giant **Online Business Essentials Certificate Accelerates Leadership Readiness**

DENVER – **The American Council of Engineering Companies of Colorado (ACEC Colorado)**, the state’s largest engineering industry business association, announced a new business education certificate – Business Essentials – in partnership with Denver-based **Jones International University (JIU)**, the pioneer in online education, to bridge the gap between technical expertise and leadership education.

The Business Essentials Certificate prepares consulting engineering professionals for leadership positions and entering entrepreneurial roles as they start-up their own firms or advance into management positions in their businesses. The curriculum includes four master’s level courses - ethics, economics, accounting and financial management. Each course is offered every month, provides statewide access and accommodates varied work schedules. The design of the certificate also enables professionals to work toward their Master’s degree, as all credits are fully transferrable to master-level higher education programs nationally.
