About the Course

The ACEC Colorado Ethics Seminar is designed to meet continuing training requirements for all engineers. This four-hour class will feature a presentation followed with interactive discussion. Continental breakfast, networking and badge pick up begin at 7:30 a.m. Registration includes a take-home copy of Ciocchetti's book, *Inspire Integrity: Chasing An Authentic Life*. Learning assessment questions that will be addressed in this course include:

1. Do you believe that the ends can always justify the means in business ethics contexts? Can unethical actions that produce a greater good pass the integrity test?
2. Do you believe that consequences are too tough to predict and therefore you should do the right things regardless of what happens?
3. Where do you fall on the golden mean of key virtues like courage, compassion and honesty? How can you become more virtuous in these areas?

As an associate professor of business ethics and legal studies in the Daniels College of Business at the University of Denver (DU), Ciocchetti is one of the university's most popular and highest-rated professors.
